## ECO EDUCATION TOPICS

#### STORMWATER

#### **Example** structure of a session

We can host up to 40 students. We split into 2 groups for the sessions, lead by 2 presenters from the above options.

9.30 - 9.50 am Eco Centre introduction

9.50 - 10.30 am Session 1

10.30 - 10.45 am Brain break activity or food break

10.45 - 11.25 am Session 2

11.25 - 11.30 am Conclusion

We can repeat this again at 12.30 - 2.30pm. We try to be flexible, so just ask.

#### **Frequently Asked Questions**

#### What facilities are available?

The Eco Centre has a classroom space that fits 50 people on chairs. It has a smartboard, Wifi and pop up tables, that are easy to move. There is an indoor break out space and an outdoor table area.

#### Is there bus / wheelchair access?

The Eco Centre has easy access for a bus to drive through and park. It has wheelchair access and an accessible toilet.

#### Is there kitchen facilities?

We have a small kitchen with a oven, urn, fridge freezer and most things you need to serve a meal. We also have a BBQ for hire. Please note groups have to take their rubbish home.

#### What does it cost to hire the Eco Centre?

If the Eco Centre staff are hosting your school group it is free or a koha. You are welcome to hire the venue as a school at the Not for Profit rate of \$15 an hour.
